Guest Column - Dr. Jennie Robinson, Huntsville City Council District 3 (and member of the Republican Women of Huntsville!)



One of the best things about serving on the City Council for the past year and a half has been all that I've learned about the City of Huntsville. There are so many great things going on! Here are some facts I've discovered that you might not know.

The total area of Huntsville is 214 square miles. That makes it the 29th largest city in land mass in the United States which is larger than Atlanta, Philadelphia, Las

Vegas, and Denver. The population of the greater Huntsville metro area has grown to nearly 400,000 people and is projected to grow to over 500,000 people in the next five years. Huntsville is the fastest growing major metro area in Alabama and the tenth fastest growing city in the southeastern US. We account for 8% of the state's population, 12% of the GDP, and Redstone Arsenal is the 9th largest county in the US for defense spending. And Huntsville still continues to have a cost of living more than 10% below the national average and average commute of less than 20 minutes. That may be why Huntsville has been listed on a number of top ten lists including list of smart cities, top engineering cities, most affordable cities, and top great places to live.

In order to prepare for this growth and continue to support the great work going on in our community, infrastructure has to keep pace. That's why we have seven road projects in progress in the city. We are sharing the \$250 million cost of these projects with the State of Alabama for the next five years. We will see a lot of orange cones in the meantime, especially along the South Parkway, but it will be a great advantage to have the infrastructure in place in advance of our very rapid growth. A little inconvenience now will yield a great quality of life later!

It is an exciting time to live in Huntsville and an honor to serve. Here's looking forward to more great things to come!

Volunteer Opportunities


